

- 7 To ensure compliance with all statutory legal requirements and in particular the Health & Safety at Work Act (1974) and Child Protection Act.
- 8 To undertake training, as/when required, as part of the Cycling Development continual development program
- **9** To attend coach Forums / Meetings as and when requested by the Track Cycling Development Officer
- To undertake any other duties commensurate with the grade as requested by the Track Cycling Development Officer
